2020 FAMILY CAMP POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

It is recommended that adults and children (of the appropriate age) wear a cloth mask when 6 feet of separation is not possible or inside while not eating.

Families will be asked to answer the following health questions prior to arrival. If any of these apply to anyone in your family we ask that you stay home.

- Have you been in close contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19 in the past 14 days? (Note: does not apply to healthcare workers equipped with proper PPE)
- Are you experiencing a cough, shortness of breath or sore throat?
- Have you had a fever in the last 48 hours?
- Have you had new loss of taste or smell?
- Have you had vomiting or diarrhea in the last 24 hours?

We will be checking temperatures at meals.

Cabins

- Each family is assigned to a single cabin. This includes immediate family, as well as relatives. This cabin is equipped with beds and mattresses, ceiling fans, and bathrooms. Families should bring their own bedding, towels and toiletries.
- We ask that families wash their hands after entering and before exiting the cabin to help reduce germs.
- Throughout the camping program, families are welcome to be in their cabins at any time. We ask that you not enter a cabin that is not assigned to your family.
- Cabins will be sanitized prior to your arrival. Staff will not enter your cabin during the camp session unless requested.

Meals

- We ask that guests sanitize their hands while entering and exiting the dining hall. Sanitizing stations are available at all entrances.

- Families will be assigned to either first or second meal for the weekend. Please only attend your assigned meal time. Families will be assigned a table(s) in the dining hall for the duration of family camp.
- Meals will be served cafeteria style by the kitchen staff, who will be wearing masks and gloves. Families will be called one family at a time to get their food from the line.
- Seconds will be called one family at a time and you will be provided with a new plate. Please do not bring used dishes to the buffet lines.
- Because of increased sanitation practices, Ellis Dining Hall will be closed during non-meal times, including overnight.

Mud Room

- We ask that guests sanitize their hands while entering and exiting the Mud Room. A Sanitizing station is available at the garage door entrance.
- Guests who choose to utilize the games provided in the Mud Room should sanitize the items after use. Sanitizing wipes are available in the Mud Room.
- Please remain physically distant from other families in the Mud Room and bathrooms.

Activities

All YMCA Camp Ocoee staff will be wearing masks while running camp activities when 6 feet of separation is not possible.

Waterfront

- Families should remain physically distant from one another while congregating on the shore line, dock, and swim areas.
- All campers 15 and under must complete a swim evaluation in order to swim in the designated swim area without a lifejacket.
- All guests will wear a lifejacket outside of the designated swim area.
- No more than one family utilizing a water toy, the waterslide or the rope swing at a time.
- When done using the life jackets, each life jacket should be dunked in the water/bleach solution outside of the paddle pad, wrung out, and hung on the appropriate racks.

- Any paddles that are used should be wiped down with the provided sanitizing wipes.
- Any kick boards that are used should be dunked in the water/bleach solution outside of the paddle pad.
- A YMCA Camp Ocoee staff member will spray down all water toys, boats and the water slide at the end of each waterfront session.

Climbing/Archery/BB's/Sling Shot Range

- Please wait on a YMCA Camp Ocoee staff member prior to entering and program area.
- No more than two families should participate at these activity areas at any time.
- We ask that any supplies, such as bb guns, bows, goggles, sling shots, etc. be sanitized with the wipes provided.

Arts and Crafts (Office Porch/Picnic Area)

- Please wait on a YMCA Camp Ocoee staff member prior to entering and program area.
- All guests will be asked to wear masks during this activity
- No more than 16 participants will be allowed to participate at a time
- We ask that guests sanitize their hands while entering and exiting the Office Porch. A Sanitizing station is available on the porch.
- When finished with a craft, guests will be asked to tidy their area and help to sanitize the tools they used.

Campfire

- Families should sit together in a group and remain as physically distant from other families as possible.
- Because of the nature of campfire and the singing, yelling, and laughing that go along with it, we ask that all guests wear a mask during this time. Those families that perform will not be asked to wear a mask while on stage.

Chapel Service

- Guests should sit one family per row with a row in between each family.
- We ask that guests wear a mask during chapel, as we will be worshipping through song.
