- Camp provides an escape for children from the real world. It provides them an opportunity to make decisions away from the parents.
- Camp provides quiet time for children to reflect on their values and spiritual life.
 With strong Christian leaders guiding them, they learn where they fit into the world and the importance of being themselves.
- We are teaching life skills through our programs that the campers will use for the rest of their lives. The communications skills, friendship skills, and learning to challenge themselves are lessons that will be important to the campers through their childhood and their adult life.
- Camp provides a safe place to learn that you must fail to succeed. Not every camper makes it to the top of the climbing wall their first time, but as they learn from their mistakes and challenge themselves to push their boundaries, they are able to succeed.
